Baked Rigatoni

1 (12 oz) pkg of Rigatoni pasta (cooked & drained)
1 lb bulk Italian sausage (cooked & drained)
Italian seasoning (add to taste to cooking sausage)
1 (26 oz) jar spaghetti sauce (I used Classico Italian Sausage with peppers & onions)
1 lb (4 cups) shredded mozzarella cheese
chopped parsley & grated parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 350°

In large bowl, combine rigatoni, sausage, parsley, sauce & 2 cups mozzarella & some grated parmesan, mix well.

Put onto greased (I used canola oil spray) baking dish, cover & bake for 40 – 45 minutes or until hot & bubbly. Uncover, top with remaining mozzarella & bake just enough to melt mozzarella. Remove from oven and let set a bit before serving.

For the amount I made for the rally, I used several different types & brands of sauce, cooking them together a bit and added some Italian herbs.
